It went from being a small local business with 25 employees to becoming an electromechanical competence centre with more than 170 employees and customers all over the world. Karsten Moholt was known for his great technical insight and his spirited service to the company's customers. Karsten Aleksander Moholt joined the business in 1998. He was a graduate engineer, educated at the Institute for electric power engineering at NTNU in Trondheim. He was soon recognized for his professional standing and his calm approach to problems. Together, Karsten and Karsten Aleksander made up a highly competent and well respected team in their field.
